

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Your child's Men ACWY and Teenage Booster vaccinations are now due

MenACWY vaccination helps to protect your child against four types of meningococcal bacteria (groups A, C, W and Y) that can cause meningitis (inflammation of the lining of the brain) and septicaemia (blood poisoning). These diseases are very serious and can kill, especially if not diagnosed early. The teenage booster, also known as the 3-in-1 or the Td/IPV vaccine, is given as a single injection into the upper arm to boost your child's protection against three separate diseases: tetanus, diphtheria and polio. We will attempt to vaccinate your child in school on 2 separate occasions. If we do not vaccinate your child in school we will contact you to make further arrangements.
